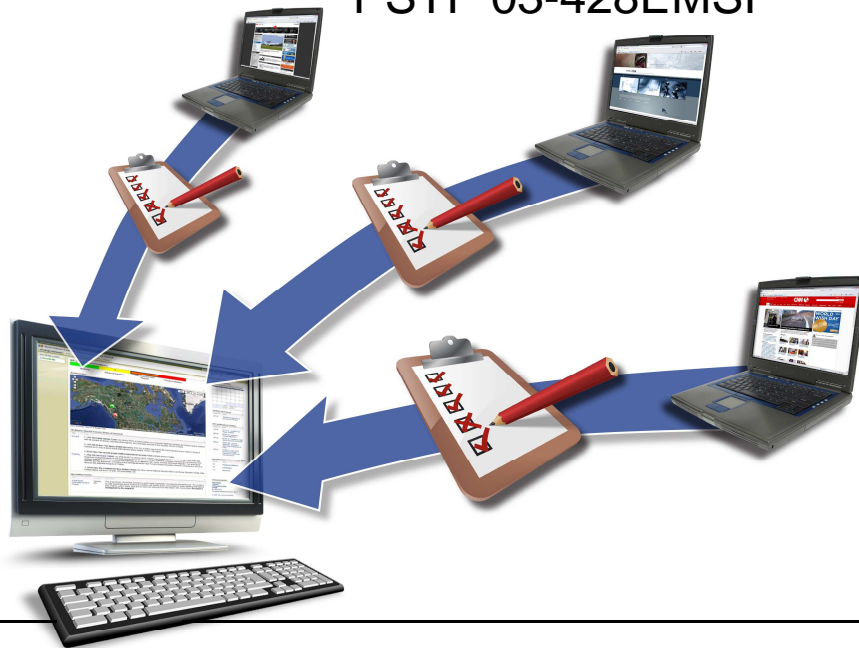

Emergency Management and System Interoperability Study #2 (“EMSI2”)

Federal Lead: Public Safety Canada – Government Operations Centre (GOC)

Objectives: The main objective of this study is to support a priority gap identified by the EMSI CoP by investigating and facilitating the development of EOC SOPs. This study objectives further involves the development / documentation of two federal EOC SOPs, the validation of these SOPs as well as the documenting and "webification" of the validated SOPs, and finally the training of the updated SOP in the form of a ½ day tutorial.

Technologies/Knowledge: AMITA will develop an online version of the updated SOPs, with the information configured in a user-friendly SharePoint 2010 site.

Outputs: 1) Federal Emergency Response SOP for developing and documenting the engagement process to be used during incidents of federal significance; 2) Unclassified Information Sharing and Reporting Procedure SOP; 3) “Interconnectivity” Web Portal; and 4) Briefing material in the form of a 1/2 day tutorial on SOP development.

Impact: Meaningful functional relationships between all key federal government stakeholders will be optimally structured and solidified under a single, overarching concept of operations as represented by the FERP to create a more tightly knit EM CoP guided by a clear set of interoperable SOPs among EOCs. This contribution will strengthen the government's resiliency while making its ongoing operations much less vulnerable to an increasingly wide range of threats.
